

The Honorable Frank W. Minor
Deputy Executive Director

In 2009, Frank Minor was selected as only the second Deputy Executive Director in the history of the Delaware River Bay Authority. In this capacity, he is directly responsible for economic development, marketing, communications, community outreach, property management, and governance activities of the bi-state agency.

In 2003, Frank was elected Mayor of Logan Township, New Jersey, which is home to the Pureland Industrial Complex, a 3,000-acre industrial park that is one of the largest in the nation and is currently serving his second term. During his tenure, he created the Logan Township Economic Development Committee, which helped to attract fifty-one (51) new companies to locate in Logan Township since 2006.

In 2004, he was chosen as President Emeritus of the Gloucester County Minority Coalition. During his tenure, the Coalition became very active in the political, economic, educational and health arenas. One year later, he was elected to the New Jersey Conference of Mayors Board of Directors.

In 2008, Frank Minor was elected the Delegation Floor Whip for the New Jersey Delegation at the Democratic National Convention. Representing the 2nd Congressional District as a District Delegate at the Democratic National Convention in Denver Colorado, he worked to elect Senator Barack Obama as the 44th President of the United States of America.

Frank has received many awards during his career, including the "Upstream Navigator Award" established in memory of the late Judge Elliot G. Heard, the Calvary Community Development Corporation's Government Leader Award, and Gloucester County Human Relations Commission's 2009 Humanitarian Public Service Award.
