

11046. RESOLUTION 15-48 – ADOPTION OF THE DELAWARE RIVER AND BAY AUTHORITY’S 2016 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (CIP)

WHEREAS, The Delaware River and Bay Authority (the “Authority”) has developed a 2016 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for capital improvement projects Authority wide in the amount of \$99,275,000.00; and
