Delaware River and Bay Authority Announces Internship Program *Opportunities Available in Multiple Career Fields*

(New Castle, DE) Today, Delaware River and Bay Authority officials announced an internship program to provide university and college students with an opportunity to gain hands-on experience in a professional work environment during the upcoming summer. The new program, which entails a 10-week summer commitment, is comprised of on-the-job experience, leadership development, exposure to senior leaders and cross-functional team experiences.

“We’re excited to offer this innovative program for the fourth consecutive year,” said Scott A. Green, Executive Director of the Delaware River and Bay Authority. “With practical assignments and specific projects, up-and-coming professionals will be able to further career and personal development. Internships are available in the following departments: Airport Operations, Communications, Culinary/Hospitality, Engineering, Executive Administration, Ferry/Marine Operations, Finance, Human Resources, Maintenance, Safety & Environmental, and Social Media/Marketing.

Interns will also have the opportunity to network and market themselves for potential future employment inside and outside of the Authority.

Prospective candidates must submit their application/resume to www.drba.net no later than **February 20, 2015**. Undergraduate students will be paid \$10 an hour for a 40-hour work week and graduate program students will be paid \$12 an hour for a 40-hour work week.
