- 1. Committee Chair Bennett opened the Budget & Finance Committee meeting at approximately 9:01 a.m. The Deputy Executive Director (DED) reported that the public meeting of the Budget & Finance Committee had been duly noticed in accordance with the Authority's Freedom of Information Regulations, read the Statement of Notice, and called the roll.
- 2. Committee Chair Bennett called for a motion to accept the Budget & Finance Committee Minutes from December 18, 2018. Commissioner Ratchford made a motion, Commissioner Smith seconded, and the Committee Minutes were accepted.
- 3. Discussion Items:
 - Ferry Fare Proposal

The Chief Financial Officer (CFO) introduced Director of Ferry Operations, Heath Gehrke, to present a ferry fare increase proposal for consideration and feedback from the Committee. Mr. Gehrke discussed the last fare changes that occurred in 2016 and the goal to improve fare box recovery and decrease cost for families over time. Mr. Gehrke highlighted several proposals including decreases of child rate (ages 6 - 13) to free during the off-season and creating a discount fare for first responders. Mr. Gehrke also discussed increases to ferry fare such as a \$1 dollar increase in vehicle fares during in-season only, making the month of June part of the Summer Fare Card and instituting a new \$35 dollar fare for 3-wheel motorcycles or motorcycles with trailers. Discussion was raised surrounding the implementation of the first responders' discount rate including police, fire and EMS personnel. The idea of conducting a growth analysis and collecting consumer feedback after a one year trial of implementing the discount rate was discussed and decided on by the Committee.

• Toll Increase

The Executive Director (ED) highlighted recent events regarding the toll increase for the Delaware Memorial Bridge. The ED noted resolution 18-49 to institute a new toll structure for the bridge was voted on and approved during the December 2018 Board of Commissioners' meeting. On January 2, 2019, the Authority received a veto letter from New Jersey Governor Murphy regarding the resolution. The ED advised that Governor Murphy did not veto the Capital Improvement Plan, but indicated a possible need for adjustments to be made. The ED advised of an upcoming meeting including New Jersey Governors' Office, Delaware Governor's Office and the Authority to discuss the matters at hand and to resolve in a timely manner.

4. Committee Chair Bennett requested an Executive Session closed to the public to discuss matters of a confidential nature. A motion was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Ford, and the Session was closed.

The following matters of a confidential nature were discussed:

• LONG RANGE PLANNING ALTERNATIVES

With no further business to discuss in Executive Session, a motion to open the meeting to the public was made by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Ratchford, and the Session was opened to the public.

5. Additional Discussion Item:

• Unaudited 2018 Operating Results

The CFO highlighted and discussed the unaudited operating results from 2018. The CFO advised of an increase of 11 percent in commercial traffic from 2.2 million transactions in 2016 to 2.45 million transactions 2018. The CFO noted this positive trend could be due to improved classification with the new toll system and a good economy. The CFO also noted commercial traffic is currently at its highest since 2006. The CFO advised traffic at the Cape May-Lewes Ferry experienced a decrease as a whole, but noted is higher than 2016 by 10,000 transactions. The CFO advised revenue increased by \$1.4 million at the bridge and \$1.1 million more in other income from E-ZPass fees totaling \$2.1 million increase above total 2017 actual revenues. The CFO discussed division funds in the 2018 budget noting the Authority ended the year \$2.3 million under budget. The CFO also advised regarding characterization codes that exceeded the budget such as benefits relating to additional pension contribution, professional fees and services relating to the bridge load rating study, and credit card fees relating to E-ZPass transaction costs associated with increased revenues.

6. With no further business to discuss, Committee Chair Bennett made a motion to adjourn and the Budget & Finance Committee adjourned at 10:11 a.m.

1. Committee Chair Carey opened the Audit & Governance Committee meeting at approximately 10:11 a.m. The Deputy Executive Director (DED) reported that the public meeting of the Audit & Governance Committee had been duly noticed in accordance with the Authority's Freedom of Information Regulations, read the Statement of Notice, and called the roll.

2. Committee Chair Carey called for a motion to accept the Audit & Governance Committee Minutes from November 20, 2018. Commissioner McCann made a motion, Commissioner Lathem seconded, and the Committee Minutes were accepted.

- 3. Discussion Items:
 - Semi-Annual Report of Status of Resolutions

The Chief Ethics Officer presented a report on the status of all Resolutions adopted by the Board which have not yet been fully implemented:

In 2018, the Board took action on 52 Resolutions, with 11 not yet fully implemented. A brief explanation of implementation status was provided and all Resolutions will continue to be tracked until fully implemented.

There are 2 Resolutions adopted in 2017 which are not yet fully implemented. A brief explanation of implementation status was provided and all Resolutions will continue to be tracked until fully implemented. Of note is Resolution 17-33 authorizing acceptance of funds from the FTA Passenger Ferry Grant Program. Due to the nature of the grant, letters of support from both Governors are necessary to allow the Authority to be a direct recipient of the grant funds. The Chief Operations Officer (COO) noted that due to the veto of Resolution 18-49, this particular project cannot proceed as previously scheduled and the necessary repowering of the ferry engine will be delayed to another year.

There is 1 Resolution adopted in 2015 which is not yet fully implemented. Resolution 15-40 authorized Amending and Restating the Authority's Defined Contribution Plan. Those amendments have been made and submitted to the IRS for review and approval, which is still pending.

• Lighthouse Hotline Implementation Review

The Chief Ethics Officer highlighted and reviewed the first year of utilizing an anonymous hotline (Lighthouse) reporting service. The Chief Ethics Officer noted that there were 28 reports about 21 separate incidents with several incidents having multiple reports filed. 10 allegations were about co-worker behavior concerns that were neither harassment/discrimination nor ethics issues; 8 allegations were made of harassment/discrimination with 1 claim substantiated and 3 allegations of ethics violations were made with one substantiated as to the underlying problem, but unsubstantiated as to unethical behavior being the cause for the inconsistent action. Regardless

of the findings, Human Resources and/or management addressed the problematic behavior raised by the reports. The Chief Ethics Officer noted a spike occurred during the middle of the year when Ethics/EEO training was taking place. Ongoing training will continue at routine intervals.
