## DRBA Commission Elects Chairman, Vice Chairman

**NEW CASTLE, Del.** – Today, Samuel E. Lathem of Bear, Delaware and James N. Hogan of Franklinville, New Jersey, were sworn-in to the leadership posts of Chairman and Vice Chairman respectively at the bi-state agency's monthly meeting. Lathem and Hogan were unanimously selected to serve in these leadership roles by their fellow Commissioners at the conclusion of last month's meeting held on January 18, 2023. The leadership posts rotate between the States of Delaware and New Jersey every two years.
