Committee Chair Decker opened the Budget & Finance Committee meeting at approximately 10:38 a.m. The Deputy Executive Director (DED) reported that the public meeting of the Budget & Finance Committee had been duly notified in accordance with the Authority's Freedom Information Regulations, read the Statement of Notice, and called the roll.
- Committee Chair Becker called for a voice vote to accept the Budget & Finance Committee Minutes from May 16, 2023. Commissioner Ratchford made a motion, Commissioner Smith seconded, and the Committee Minutes were accepted.

3. Action Items:

RESOLUTION 23-26 - AUTHORIZING AUTHORITY EXPENDITURES PURSUANT TO RESOLUTION 01-84 FOR THE PERIOD, JANUARY 1, 2023, THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2023

The CFO discussed and answered questions regarding purchasing parking blocks to expand the Wilmington Airport parking lot. Given the service expansion with Avelo Airlines the parking spots would be paid and generate airport revenue. Commissioner Ratchford asked about the location of Lot C. The CFO confirmed Lot C is the old Air Transport Command restaurant parking lot. With no additional questions, Commissioner Ransome made a motion, Commissioner Ratchford seconded, and the Budget & Finance Committee recommended forwarding Resolution 23-26 to the full Board. The Resolution will be presented to the full Board for consideration at the June meeting later today.

RESOLUTION 23-27 – AUTHORIZES A CONTRACT BETWEEN THE DELAWARE RIVER AND BAY AUTHORITY AND KAPLAN KIRSCH & ROCKWELL LLP TO PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL "ON CALL" AIRPORT LEGAL COUNSEL TO THE AUTHORITY

The CFO confirmed the Authority went out for an RFP and received 5-6 responses with the committee recommending KKR. Commissioner Ratchford inquired about what kind of issues do we have that require a specialized law firm. The Deputy Executive Director noted the audit at Millville Airport mid-July, the termination process with New Castle County and other on-going issues with the FAA. With no additional questions, Commissioner Becker made a motion, Commissioner Ratchford seconded, and the Budget & Finance Committee recommended forwarding Resolution 23-27 to the full Board. The Resolution will be presented to the full Board for consideration at the June meeting later today.

Ms. Betterly noted that the developer has been working with the DRBA to address our concerns since that time. As with other issues impacting airport property, FAA approval is necessary for this Resolution to be fully effectuated. With no additional questions, Commissioner Becker made a motion, Commissioner Ratchford seconded, and the Economic Development Committee recommended forwarding Resolution 23-38 to the full Board.
